1. Arrive New Orleans

Tour begins: 5:30 PM, Four Seasons Hotel New Orleans.

A transfer is included from Louis Armstrong International Airport to The Four Seasons Hotel New Orleans, ideally located in the heart of the city overlooking the Mississippi River. This evening, join us for a welcome reception and dinner at famed New Orleans restaurant, serving up Creole cuisine and Dixieland jazz since the early 1900s. **Meals D**

2. Make history in New Orleans

This morning you'll embark on a walking tour of the Garden District with a local guide, seeing ancient live oaks, stately mansions centuries old and manicured parks. Have lunch as you please, then join us for an informative visit to the

acclaimed National World War II Museum that includes viewing the "4D" film, *Beyond All Boundaries*, narrated by Tom Hanks. The remainder of the day is free. **Meals BLD**

3. ■ Tour the French Quarter and embarkation

A discovery-filled day in this amazing city starts with a locally guided tour of the French Quarter, resplendent in lacey wrought iron balconies, pastel hued homes and French, Spanish and American architectural influences. Continue to the New Orleans School of Cooking for a private cooking demonstration and lunch, followed by a private jazz performance at the famed Preservation Hall. Embark the *American Duchess* this afternoon for your 7-night cruise on the Mississippi River; your bags will already be aboard! **Meals BLD**

4. ■ Life in the Bayou & Sugarcane

Dock near Nottoway and disembark for a tour of the mansion – a former sugarcane plantation, it is one of the South's largest historic homes, layered with grand balconies, white columns and a three-story rotunda that overlooks sweeping, oak-draped lawns. Then we drive out to the eerily beautiful Manchac Swamp for a boat ride into the bayous with a wetlands expert. Learn about life in the Louisiana Wetlands, and the inhabitants of the swamp, including the American Alligator. Hear stories about the unique history of the Cajun town of Frenier, a ghost town with haunted tales to tell. **Meals BLD**

5. ■ Stroll back in time in St. Francisville

Dock in St. Francisville, a hidden gem of Louisiana towns with pre-Civil War mansions and historic homes with diverse architectural styles. Explore with a local guide who shares anecdotes about the people who lived here,

including the artist John James Audubon. Audubon worked as a tutor at the Oakley Plantation and spent his free time combing the woods for bird specimens. The abundance of bird life inspired one of Audubon's most successful artistic periods with many of his watercolor illustrations appearing in his book, *The Birds of America*. Enjoy time at leisure to stroll its charming streets before returning to the riverboat for lunch and an afternoon and evening cruising. **Meals BLD**

6. ■ A day in historic Natchez

This morning, disembark for a full-day excursion to explore Natchez. Located at the terminus of a foot highway, the Natchez Trace, used by Native Americans, the city grew exponentially as ship traffic increased on the Mississippi River. Flatboats unloaded their cargo here before their crew returned home by foot up the Trace. This process was revolutionized by the invention of the steamship, a development that led to the establishment and growth of the cotton industry, and the darker side of that boom – slavery. Walk through the centuries in this town where American history converges. **Meals BLD**

7. ■ Vicksburg, remembering the Civil War

Disembark for a locally guided tour of Vicksburg. In talking about its significance in the Civil War, Abraham Lincoln said: "Vicksburg is the key. The war can never be brought to a close until the key is in our pocket." At Vicksburg National Military Park, step back 150 years to the 47-day siege that ended on July 4, 1863, giving the Union control of the Mississippi. Explore the park with a National Park Service guide; see the *U.S.S. Cairo*, raised from the bottom of the Yazoo River. This afternoon, explore 19th-century Vicksburg on a guided tour of the city's oldest neighborhood; go inside Christ Episcopal Church, built in 1846, and the Duff Green Mansion, which was converted to a war-time hospital for soldiers on both sides. **Meals BLD**

8. ■ Discover the Delta Blues

Dock in Greenville, Mississippi. Nearby Indianola is the birthplace of blues legend B.B. King. Learn about the history of development of the musical style at the museum that bears his name. Experience this rich musical tradition before charting a course towards Tennessee. **Meals BLD**

9. ■ Steamboatin'

Spend the entire day enjoying a trip back in time to the genteel era of steamboat travel. Relax onboard as your riverboat navigates the mighty Mississippi past towns and scenic vistas once frequented by author Mark Twain who

wrote about river in many of his works. Learn what makes a steam paddle wheeler work on a tour with a crew member and enjoy a Steamboatin' party this evening. **Meals BLD**

10. Disembark in Memphis

Disembark ship in Memphis this morning. Learn about its musical legacy on a city tour with a local musician that includes Sun Studio, Beale Street, Stax Studio, Cotton Row, Overton Park, Historic Central Gardens, and St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital. Pass by the homes where music legends like Elvis, B. B. King, and Johnny Cash lived. After a local barbecue lunch, head to Lorraine Motel where Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated while a guest at the motel, site of the National Civil Rights Museum. Join us for a farewell dinner tonight. **Meals BLD**

11. Journey Home

Tour ends: 9:00 AM at The Peabody Memphis. Fly home anytime. A transfer is included from The Peabody Memphis or the Guest House at Graceland to Memphis International Airport. Allow two hours for flight check-in. **Meals BLD**
